



"Drinking and lust. No man can match me in these things. I am the god of tits and wine...I shall build a shrine to myself at the next brothel I visit."






Josh Dissek joined the league 6 years ago, in 2012, and his family has regretted it ever since.




POWER RANKINGS

After much computation (with a little assistance from Computer Jerry), the following Power Rankings were generated based off of the strength of each team's keepers (as ranked by FantasyPros.com's Expert Consensus Rankings) compared to 2018 keeper salaries. A score combining the two factors was created, with a lower score indicating that there are more higher ranked keepers per Computer Jerry Buck than other teams. Some attempt was made to prioritize QB and TE keepers, given those position's expected scarcity. I'm not sure this is entirely valid, as the Prophylactic Simians didn't come out in 1st place, but here they are regardless....

This roster is packed with talent, with many other keepable options: WR Thielen (10 CJBs), WR Baldwin (24 CJBs), WR Cooks (31 CJBs), QB Trubisky (10 CJBs), and RB Collins (10 CJBs)....amongst others. And depending on hold out status of Bell, the possibility exists that Bell is cut and replaced by one of these players...only time will tell.

QB Brady (61 CJBs) and RB McCoy (53 CJBs) are just too old to warrant their big price tags, and get thrown back into the free agent pool.

Both WR Beckham and RB Chris Carson (1 CJB) can be kept with NO salary increase, due to a new 2018 rule mandating that no salary increase occurs for players missing 8 or more games the previous season. Carson lost a ton of value after Seattle drafted RB Rasheed Penny, but regained a bit when Penny broke his finger...but either way, Carson isn't really a viable keeper given the other options available.

Also, as per new 2018 rule, if four players are kept - then a K can be kept, with no salary increase. Since Lutz was SKFFL's 7th ranked kicker and plays for a high octane offense (NO), it is a no brainer to retain his services for 1 CJB.

The downside to this potential crop of keepers - injury/holdout risk and high cost. These five players missed a combined 18 regular season games in the 2017 season, and represent over ⅓ of the total salary cap. That being said, Bell and Beckham are elite talents, and with this league now supporting TWO starting TE spots in 2018, having a stud TE like Ertz can make a huge

It may seem unlikely that a team in this 2QB league goes into the draft with no keeper QBs - but that's what will happen here. Jake has studs - QB Wilson and QB Brees - but their salaries combine for 91 CJBs, which is a wee bit too much.

To counter the lack of a keepable QB, though, the Colonists likely keep two top 15 RBs and two top 10 WRs. It is possible that RB Mixon (19 CJBs) is subbed in for Hunt to save a bit of salary, or that WR Hill is replaced with TE Engram (10 CJBs). There is ZERO chance, however, that WR Antonio Brown is not kept, even at 28 CJBs...Brown scored almost 260 points in Suicide Kings last year, ranking second by 2 points to WR Hopkins...and almost 30 points higher than the next contender.

In addition to Wilson and Brees, it looks like monster TE Rob Gronkowski (39 CJBs) also joins the unemployment line this season. TEs will be king in 2018, but 39 CJBs is just too big of a hit to easily absorb.

And again, this roster seems likely to keep a cheap and top 5 2017 K, if only to prevent Nik from outbidding him on a K in the auction.

With two top RBs and WRs, Jake's likely draft focus is on getting the best two QBs he can.

This is the trickiest set of keepers to project, as Nik can keep any unkept player in the league, in addition to what it available on the former IDGAF roster. The IDGAF roster is a bit sparse, but does have TE Travis Kelce for 19 CJBs and a decent 1 CJB kicker. The IDGAF roster WOULD have also had QB Cousins, if not for some late season shenanigans, but that doesn't stop Nik from scooping him up as a keeper off of the Beaver Hunter's roster.

There are lots of other keepable options, when your options include all players not kept...I'm guessing a 10 CJB top 12 WR in Thielen off of the Simian's roster looks good, along with a 19 CJB top 15 RB in Mixon off of the Mars Colonist's squad. There are a whole slew of other possibilities - a 10 CJB RB Collins from the Simians, a 16 CJB WR Robinson from the Beaver Hunters, a 13 CJB RB Ajayi from Team Average, or a 10 CJB TE Engram, amongst others. Only Nik knows who he's going to pick. Or he'll do the absolute minimum in preparation and just go with this list.

If this sort of balanced approach is taken, and keeper costs are kept down, then Nik has flexibility to go in any direction with this draft. So naturally, he'll overpay for two defenses.

There are a couple of ways this could go - standard convention has most teams keeping at least one QB, given the scarcity of the position in a 10 team 2 QB league....and Drew does have a keepable QB, with QB Matt Ryan at 18 CJBs. That being said, Drew has the unique opportunity to keep two potentially elite RBs and give himself a leg up with a top ranked TE in a season where this league will start requiring 2 starting TEs. As an added bonus, Cook's salary doesn't increase next season, due to the fact that only 4 games were played in 2017.

Other possible keepers, if Drew prefers to preserve salary, include CHI RB Cohen and CLE RB Johnson for 10 CJBs each, as well as MIA WR Landry and DET WR Marvin Jones. He could opt to go into the draft with one of those over Elliot, which would give him one of the cheapest set of keepers, with his 5 players going for 50 CJBs total. I do not consider this a likely outcome, however, despite Elliot's considerable salary. Drew is probably asking himself, "What would Computer Jerry do?"

In addition to one of the several studs listed above, it looks like QB Roethlisberger, RB CJ Anderson, RB Mack, and TE Walker will also hit the open market.

Aside from overpaying for a K or three, Drew will desperately try to grab himself with one of the top remaining QBs...but after spending the most in keeper salaries, he won't have as much ammunition as the rest of the league.



Our second team that will likely forego keeping a QB - although Tami does have QB Stafford and QB Rivers, both a little pricey but still keepable. On the other hand, it is not likely that a RB of McCaffrey's caliber is available in the draft at 26 CJBs...yes, McCaffrey has to contend with CJ Anderson, but they're likely to compliment each other more than eat into each other's workload.

In addition to a highly ranked RB, Tami has a decent and studly young WR corps that can act as a nucleus to a potential powerhouse team. JuJu could possibly be subbed out for a slightly more expensive Golden Tate (16 CJBs) - it could go either way.

Additionally, TE Graham gets revitalized in Green Bay - perfect timing for our first 2 starting TE season.

Tami is eligible to keep a K with no salary increase - and while Gostkowski will rank amongst the most expensive kickers drafted, there's no denying the potential upside in New England's offense. This roster has an embarrassment of riches in terms of QBs, with several keepable options - Winston, Watson, Flacco, and even Manning. Watson is the cheapest, isn't currently serving a suspension, and has the highest ceiling.

Josh might flirt with keeping a 45 CJB AJ Green, rather than a suspended RB Ingram - there's a lot of risk inherent in keeping a RB who starts the season riding the pine while a younger studly Kamara gets to run wild. On the other hand, 10 CJBs isn't a ton to pay for a highly ranked RB/flex starter boost in the midseason, and who knows where Ingram plays next season? The talent is there, even if the opportunity is not - currently. Plus, Josh doesn't have a lot of other great options.

It's possible Ken considers keeping a 10 CJB QB Alex Smith, who had a banner year last season - but is definitely a candidate for regression. QB Newton is a stud, but an expensive one at 30 CJBs. There are also some good WR candidates for retention - including WR Jeffery (29 CJBs and injured), WR Cooper (24 CJBs), and WR Allen Robinson (13 CJBs, with no increase in salary from last season - and a member of the Chicago Bears, which we know is especially appealing to Ken).

But ultimately, an elite RB coupled with a top 10 RB, along with an elite WR and a really good TE warrants cutting bait on those other players.

Another substandard team with substandard keeper options - I'd be tempted to keep no one and start anew. TE Jordan Reed is a risk, but probably one worth taking, given the new TE focus of this league. Dak, while flawed last season, is still an upper echelon QB and another forced keeper. RB Howard is...eh, OK. Joe could decide to go with a 10 CJB Henry, 13 CJB Crowell or 20 CJB Hyde, but I think he errs on the side of cheap and shoots for a total rebuild.

Joe also has stud WR TY Hilton available at 33 CJBs...but given the fact that he's coming off of a down year and we still don't really know where QB Luck is at this season...it might not be a bad idea to forget about it and apply the cash to more proven players this season.

After that, there's a lot of substandard 10 CJB players that could be kept - the same players that directly contributed to a second-from-last place finish. Purge 'em, and start fresh. Probably start with a WR or four.

Erik could mix these guys up in a multitude of ways and still come out ahead.

The projected set of keepers includes top options at the RB, WR, and TE positions. Kamara gets a boost thanks to Ingram's 4 game suspension. WR Hopkins was a league leader last year in terms of fantasy points scored, and WR Diggs was no slouch either. TE Olsen is perennially a target monster for CAR, and would've been in 2017 if it weren't for injuries.
